Susan Daitch is the author of four novels and a collection of short stories, most recently *The Lost Civilization of Suolucidir*, published by City Lights Books. Her other novels include *Paper Conspiracies* and *The Colorist*. She has been the recipient of a NEA Heritage award, two Vogelstein awards, and a New York Foundation for the Arts fellowship in fiction. Her short fiction and essays have appeared in *Guernica, Tablet, Conjunctions, Slice* and *Tin House*.

Idra Novey's novel, *Ways to Disappear*, was recently released by Little Brown. Her poetry collections include *Exit, Civilian*; *The Next Country* and *Clarice: the Visitor*, a collaboration with the artist Erica Baum. She has written for *The New York Times, Slate*, and *The Paris Review*. She is the recipient of awards from the National Endowment for the Arts, The Poetry Foundation and The Poetry Society of America. She has translated the work of a number of Brazilian writers, including Clarice Lispector. She has taught at Columbia, NYU, Fordham and Princeton.

Stephen O'Connor is the author of *Thomas Jefferson Dreams of Sally Hemmings*, a novel, and two collections of short fiction, *Here Comes Another Lesson* and *Rescue*. He is also the author of two works of non-fiction, *Will My Name be Shouted Out?* and *Orphan Trains*. His fiction has been published in *The New Yorker*, *Best American Short Stories*, *Conjunctions*, *One Story* and many other places. His story "Ziggurat" was read on Selected Shorts by Tim Curry. James Yeh is a founding editor of the literary and arts magazine *Gigantic* and the culture editor at Vice.com.
