An Assistant Professor at Brooklyn College, Burgess also teaches poetry in the New York City public schools with the Teachers & Writers Collaborative. He recently edited an anthology of visual art and writing titled *Dream Closet: Meditations on Childhood Space*.

Darrel Alejandro Holnes is a poet and playwright from Panama. His poetry has been previously published in *Poetry Magazine, American Poetry Review, Callaloo, Best American Experimental Writing, Gulf Coast, Day One*, and in numerous other journals. Judith E. Stein, the author of *Eye of the Sixties, Richard Bellamy and the Transformation of Modern Art*, is a writer and curator specializing in postwar American art. For the Pennsylvania Academy of the Arts she curated the award-winning *I Tell My Heart, The Art of Horace Pippin*, seen in New York at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. A former arts reviewer for NPR's *Fresh Air* and *Morning Edition*, she has written for *Art in America, The New York Times Book Review*, and numerous museum publications.
